






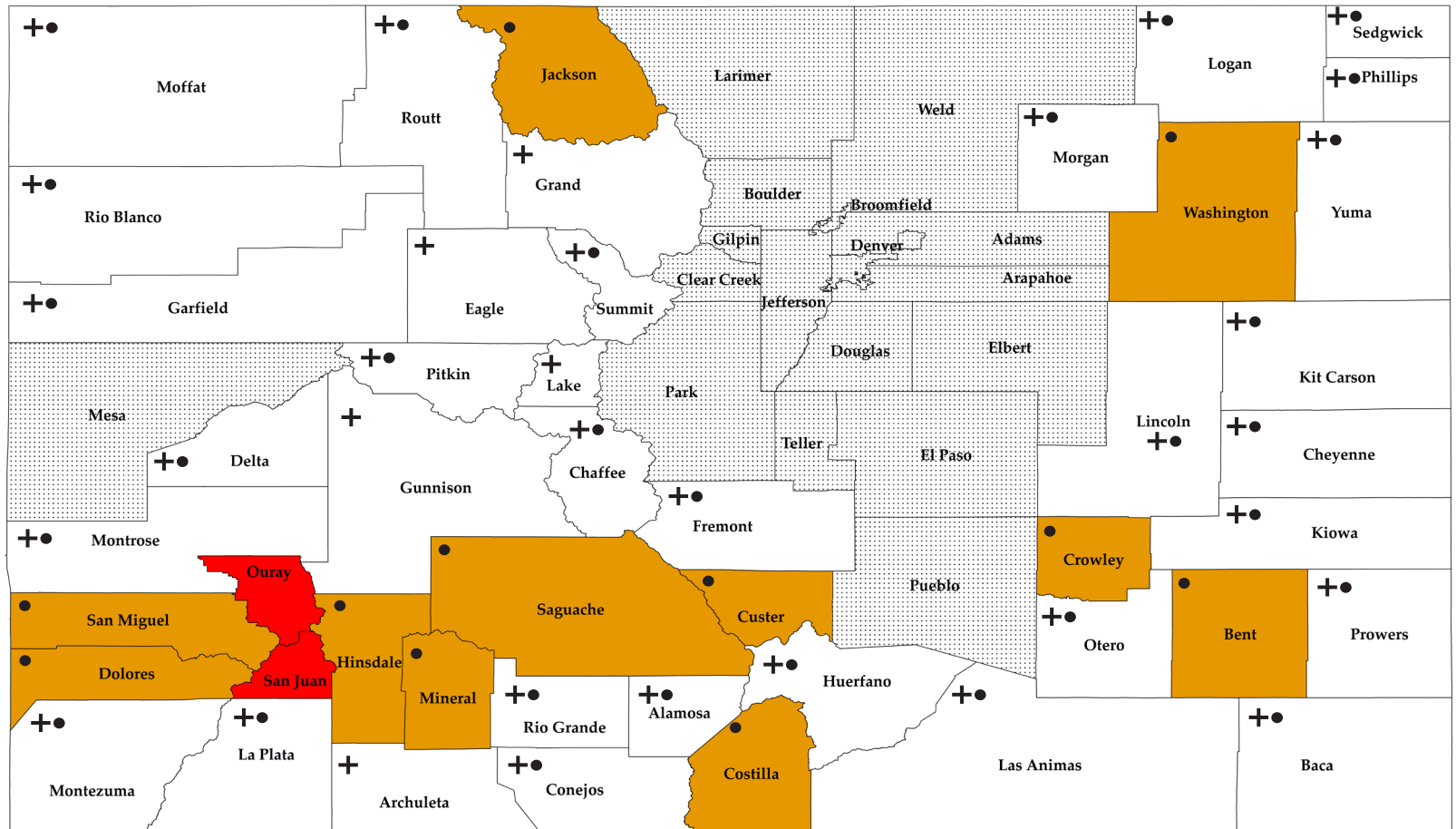
Rural Colorado: Access to Healthcare, 2014
