

Rural and Frontier Health Care Preceptor Tax Credit

Everything you need to know about tax incentives aimed at increasing the rural primary healthcare workforce!

WHO can take advantage? and WHAT do I get?

WHO is Eligible?

Only uncompensated* Primary Care preceptors from the following Primary Care Specialties are eligible:

- Medical Doctor
- Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine
- Advanced Practice Nurse
- Physician Assistant
- Doctor of Dental Surgery or Doctor of Dental Medicine

- Registered Nurse
- Registered Dental Hygienist
- Licensed Clinical or Counseling Psychologist
- Licensed Clinical Social Worker
- Licensed Professional Counselor
- Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist
- Psychiatric Nurse Specialist
- Licensed Addiction Counselor
- Certified Addiction Counselor working in an outpatient clinical setting

*Uncompensated preceptor means a preceptor who does not receive any payment from the institute of higher education for providing the rotation.



WHAT do I get?

\$2,000

Tax credit per rotation

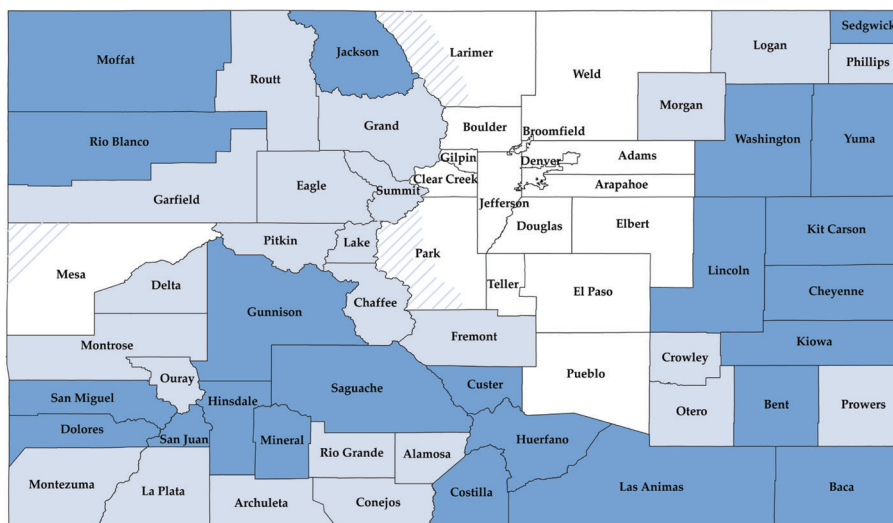
with a maximum of 3 credits claimed per year for a total of

\$6,000

in annual tax credits

WHERE do I have to be precepting?

Only preceptors working in a rural or frontier designated county are eligible for the tax credit.

How to Claim the Credit

PRECEPTORS

HOW do I claim my credit?

You must submit a certified form to the DOR to claim the credit.

1. Complete an eligible primary care preceptorship in a rural or frontier county.
2. Complete the Rural and Frontier Health Care Preceptor Tax Credit form (leave SSN blank). The form can be accessed through each of the regional AHEC's website or CRHC's website (<http://coruralhealth.org/preceptor-survey>).
3. Submit the form to a certifying body, which includes either the health professional schools affiliated with the student, or your regional AHEC office. AHEC may charge a fee for certification.
4. The tax credit form will be certified and sent back to you. Add your SSN and submit the form to the DOR via: dor_preceptor@state.co.us
5. DOR will contact you with notification of approval or denial of the credit. If approved, file the certified tax credit form during the next tax filing cycle.
