HRSA Rural Health Network Development Planning Program FOA

The purpose of the Rural Health Network **Development Planning Program** ("Network Planning Program") is to plan and develop integrated healthcare networks that collaborate to address the following legislative aims: (i) achieve efficiencies; (ii) expand access to and improve the quality of basic health care services and health outcomes; and (iii) strengthen the rural health care system. This program supports one year of planning and brings together members of the health care delivery system, particularly those entities that may not have collaborated in the past, to establish and/or improve local capacity to strengthen rural community health interventions and enhance care coordination. Eligible entities include public, or private, nonprofit or for-profit, community-based, and tribal governments (governments, organizations) located in the U.S. The applicant organization may be located in a rural or urban area but must have demonstrated experience serving, or the capacity to serve, rural underserved populations. Applications are due January 26, 2024. You can find more information here.

Colorectal Screening Program

The Colorado Cancer Screening Program (CCSP) is a statewide initiative in partnership with local, state, and national clinical and community organizations. Its goal is to implement evidence-based interventions (EBI) for cancer screening, patient navigation, and population-based research in cancer prevention and control, focusing on promoting health equity. The CCSP provides training and technical support for healthcare teams to implement initiatives to reduce barriers and improve access to care. The program is administered through the University of Colorado Cancer Center and is funded by the Cancer, Cardiovascular, and Pulmonary Disease (CCPD) Grants Program. CRHC will be offering technical assistance to this program. Including Colorectal Screening in the CAP allows participants to extract information directly from the CAP system to clinic staff, streamlining the process and eliminating the need to navigate a complex EMR. This advancement is significant, benefiting not only rural facilities but also acknowledging the effort invested in creating and readily offering these dashboards. Please contact Jen Grant -

Rural Connectivity Project News and Updates

R7 Payments

A Sustainability Payment of \$100,000 per Critical Access Hospital and \$20,000 per Rural Health Center will be issued on March 1, 2024, and each subsequent year on August 1st annually for all qualified rural providers participating in the state's Rural Connectivity Program.

At a minimum, to qualify for this payment or partial payment, a participating rural provider must be connected to one of the state's Health Information Exchanges (HIEs) and the Community Analytics Platform (CAP) established by the Office of eHealth Innovation.

- a. The participating rural provider has a signed agreement with one of the Colorado Health Information Exchanges (HIEs) so the participating rural provider can view medical records contained within the HIE.
- b. The participating rural provider has a signed participation agreement(PA) with the vendor (CCMCN) managing the Community Analytics Platform (CAP) so that the participating rural provider is accessing the CAP and authorizing the vendor managing the CAP to capture data on their behalf. To be eligible for the sustainability payment, organizations must complete a participation agreement by **1/26/2024.**

- Patients who are up-to-date or on schedule patients and patients who are overdue or off schedule.
- Schedule breakdowns and adherence for all recommended childhood immunizations.
- Number of doses administered for each immunization type.
- Demographic characteristics for the population included in the report.
