

COVID-19 Immunization data can now be seen within the CAP for organizations that have completed a CIIS agreement.








Community Analytics Platform - Cancer Report

What will be included in the Cancer Report?

- □ Data related to breast, prostate, cervical, colorectal, skin, lung, and uterine cancer for population served.
- ☐ Insight into their patient population who have:
 - A cancer diagnosis
 - Received cancer treatment
 - A cancer-related death
- Data on population eligible for screening and screening metrics for breast, cervical, colorectal, and prostate cancer.
- Social and Demographic information including age, race/ethnicity, gender identity, sex, payer, and more.
