






Medicaid Disenrollment

575,605 (33.4% change) Medicaid members were disenrolled in the year after the public health emergency ended. This was the largest net Medicaid enrollment decline identified in the country.¹

High disenrollment numbers have led to an increase in the uninsured population across the state of Colorado. The Colorado Hospital Association reported that hospitals have seen over a **50%** increase in patients without insurance seeking care in the emergency department. Over **10%** of patients seeking care in the emergency department are now uninsured, up from **6.6%** to **7%** before and throughout the pandemic.¹




65% of Coloradans lost Medicaid coverage due to procedural disenrollment, which can be a result of not receiving renewal notices, lack of timely document processing by eligibility staff, or lack of knowledge in requirements. This means that there are Coloradans who still qualify for Medicaid but are going without coverage.¹

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


Medicaid disenrollment information can be viewed within the community analytics platform for organizations that have completed Trading Partner authorization.

Unique Rural Medicaid Member Disenrollment ≥ 1 month Total Members = <u>18,804</u>*




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Note. Counts are for participating rural providers who have completed trading partner (TP) authorization. Members can be duplicated across counties if there was change of address during the timeframe.
